## WARNING

- Do not tape down or otherwise by-pass any safety devices! Always operate this equipment from the designated operator's position.
- Never operate power equipment of any kind if you are tired or if you are under the influence of alcohol, drugs, medication, or any substance that could affect your ability or judgment. Be alert! ## IMPORTANT SAFETY RULES TO FOLLOW

- 1. Do not use power tools in damp or wet locations. Do not expose power tools to rain. Failure to follow these instructions increases the risk of electrocution.
- 2. Avoid gaseous areas. Do not operate electric saw in explosive atmospheres in presence of flammable liquids or gases. This motor creates sparks, which could ignite fumes.
- 3. Do not wear loose clothing or jewelry. Wear safety glasses, ear protection, and dust mask. Keep hands away from cutting area and blade.
- 4. Always inspect saw for frayed or damaged cords. Do not use if saw is not in proper working order. Keep cords away from cutting area when operating saw.
- 5. Avoid accidental starting. Be sure the switch is in the "OFF" position before plugging into outlet. Do not carry plugged in tool with finger on switch.
- 6. Do not use dull or damaged blades. Keep blade guards in place and in working order.
- 7. Do not operate the saw if the lower guard does not move freely and close instantly. Never clamp or tie the lower guard into the open position. Raise and lower guard only with the lower guard lift level.
- 8. Do not run the saw while carrying it at your side.
- 9. Secure wood before sawing; never hold pieces for cutting in your hand or across legs.
- 10. Keep second hand on auxiliary handle, not near the blade.
- 11. Do not attempt to remove cut material when blade is moving.
- 12. Make sure that the blade RPM matches the RPM output of the saw.
- 13. KICKBACK CAN OCCUR AT ANY TIME! DO NOT USE DULL BLADE & SUPPORT WORK PROPERLY.
